THE ONE VICTIM THAT DID TESTIFY, AGE 9, IS
REGISTERED AS A CUB SCOUT WITH LDS BRYAN WARD II PACK 968
(PARENTS OF OTHER BOYS WOULD NOT PERMIT THEIR SONS TO BE INVOLVED
FURTHER). ACCORDING TO COURTROOM TESTIMONY COMPLAINED
OF SPANKINGS HE WAS RECEIVING ON A REGULAR BASIS AT DUMLAP'S HOUSE.

THE BOY'S FATHER, WAS NOT TOO CONCERNED ABOUT THIS,
IN AS MUCH AS THE FAMILIES WERE VERY CLOSE. EXPLAINED
FURTHER TO HIS DAD THAT THE SPANKINGS INVOLVED REMOVAL OF OUTER

Man pleads guilty in child molesting case, gets 12-year sentence

A 39-year-old Bryan man pleaded guilty Thursday to charges that he molested a 9-year-old boy last December. In exchange, he was sentenced to 12 years in prison and fined \$4,000.

Alan Craig Dunlap, of 2305 Stauton Drive, pleaded guilty midway through his trial for indecency with a child. The plea agreement was reached with prosecutors following testimony from the victim, the victim's father and the defendant's stepson.

Prosecutor Rod Boyles said afterward that Dunlap, a outmaster and Sunday School teacher, had a history of '-sex offenses. Boyles said the maximum punish-. for Dunian would have been 20 years in the Texas

Department of Corrections.

Bryanite indicted on charge of Social Security deception

HOUSTON - A former Bryan resident has been indicted in federal court here on five counts of using Social Security numbers belonging to other people.

The indictment alleges that Boyd George Hall, now of Houston, used the invalid numbers to sign and identify himself on oil, gas and mineral leases. Each count carries a maximum punishment of five years in prison and a \$5,000 fine.



My son has been involved with the scout program thru Powers School for several years and in the past two years in the Webelos program, of which Alan Dunlap unfortunately was in charge. My son went through some very tramatic experiences as a result of being associated with Mr. Dunlap, while under his care, custody and control.

It is my understanding that your office was investigating the situation regarding this man. I feel that your office was extremely imprudent to allow him to continue as a scout leader, under those circumstances, and allow him to having anything to do with the boys.

I have incurred medical empenses as a result of this problem and empect to incur future medical and psychiatric bills with regard to my son's tramatic upset. I will look to your insurance carrier for payment of medical bills, and what ever damages are ascertained at a later date.

I also deplore the conduct of Hr. Allen Dunlep with regards to his association with the youngsters in the Scout Troop and the Cub Pack at the Mawona Junior High.

Despite the newspaper's story we were apprised of this deplorable conduct on December 29, 1972, by his.

We promptly contected the Police In Fresno, and en January the 2nd, Descetive Armett talked with us, who provided him with names of all the boys in the Peck, and in the Treep. He indicated what he and other officers would be in contact with each of the parents, at least these were his plans at the time we talked to him, an January the 2nd.

Meentime, naturally the various parents of boys who were molested contected the Police Department and the District Attorney's office and the man was arrested several times, and to our dismay was released with no bail by various Judges. On January the 2nd, I spake with Mr. Fortner, member of the Troop Committee, and he indicated that the Unit was now aware of Mr. Dunlap's conduct and have taken steps to make sure he would not in any way be connected with the boys in that Unit anymero.

Its. until conviction is actually secured, which it did on January 12, 1973, when it. Dunlap pleaded guilty, we were dealing only with hearsay, although it appeared to be guite reliable, by experience we have found that sematimes when the matter cemes to court, the people refrain from testifying, and the case gets dismissed. Fortunately this did not take place on this excession.

Thus, you will note, we first became aware of it on December 29, 1972, at 3:30 in the afternoon. Immediately after New Years holiday, I spoke with the Police on Jenuary the 2nd, talked to the Unit Committee on Jenuary the 2nd, and now have your letter of Jenuary the 15th, so our relationship with this unfortunate event has been of a very short duration. I am not aware why the newspaper phrased the story as to Imply this was an ivestigation of a long period of time. What was told to the newspaper was that the boys indicated this man had been doing these things to the boys for a long period of time. But we were only made aware of it barely 2½ weeks ago.

I am sorry we did not know about it somer. I know the parents, according to enly became acquainted with it just a day or two prior to her call to us.

If there is enything further I can do to help you, please feel free to call on me.

Our family is much concerned for the safety of three children, age 13— age 10 and Ago 8.

My grandchildren, living at the freshoot.

Mr Alan Dunlap, 85 E. Fountain way, Fresno, was arrested and put in jail on December 17 and was released shortly after without posting bail, we were told. He was arrested for the worse kind of sex deviation acts with our grandchildren and one of their friends it was not just a one time act with these children, but done many times over a long period of time with well planned ways of holding the silence of these children. This silence was brecken by one last time of it done to the youngest of these children, when the begathen decided for themselves that it had to be stepped and they told the story. The Sherriffs effice was contacted and a Mr G. Hill was sent out to make the investigation.

Hill spont several hours getting all of the information from these three children and one other of their friends who was involved. These boys gave Hr Hill the names of other boys when they know that had also been used by Hr Alan Dunlap in this act. Hr Hill was also told that Alan Dunlap was a Boy Escut leader and had worked with the the Boy Scouts and the Cub Scouts in the north and of Freene over the past four years and that it was through his Scout work that his censets and friendships had been made which was his centact with these beyon

After taking the statements of these children Mr Hill said that he would be contacting the parents of the other boys whose memors had been given to him end also that he would be contacting the head of the Boy Scouts here to trace demages that possibly might have been done to other boys in thise

On the night of Documber 17, after the man had been jailed, Mr Hill called to tell my daughter that he was jailed and stated that Alan Dunlap had been cooperative in the arrest and had admitted to all of the charges made and had admitted the matter with the other beys whose names had been given to Mr Hill. With this, no further investigation is indeed strange.

We have learned from that one other parent has filed new charges and waited, to be sure that Mr Dunlap would be arrested and placed in Jail again. Should people have to attempt to arrange matters this way for some protestion? We also have been teld that another parent plans to file charged in Madera County new just in case this thing is treated lightly in Freene county for Mr Dunlape. We are told that their son was abused in a Scout Comp on the property of a Madera rancher in Madera County.

With all of these facts and my conversation with Mr Hill by tolephono last Saturday, it leaves us with the feeling that someone, some places has attempted to hold this thing down for Mr Dunlap and to try to protect him from further charges against him and to cover it up. It is an almost incredible story, her this man operated and the number of beyn that he has abused and used. It is equally incredible how it has been treated by the law enforcement department. Few crimes, that reach the stage of being arrested for escape mention in the newspapers. He mention of this arrest was made. Why?

It would be so then appreciated new if you could give some time to this case and to see that it is carried out to justice and to the protection of the children this man has harmed. It would be appreciated if you could see that a full investigation is made over the full period of time that Mr Dunlap was working with the Boy Scouts. The case is far recebing and the full demages done by this man can, I am sure, mover be known. Your attention to this case will be appreciated.
