Carmel Man Gets 16-Year Prison Term

SALINAS - A Carmel man was sentenced Tuesday to 16 years in state prison for molesting three children over a 14-month period in 1984 and 1985.

Nicolas Paul d'Ombrain, 37, convicted by a jury March 20 of 11 felony counts and one misdemeanor count of child molestation, wasgiven the maximum term by Superior Court Judge Robert Hinrichs, who presided at the trial.

The prosecutor, Deputy District Attorney Robert Hatton, asked for a term of 12 years. But Hinrichs said d'Ombrain had abused a position of trust and his crimes showed "cruelty and callousness."

Also, the judge said, d'Ombrain had denied the crimes when he testified at the trial and had chal-! lenged the testimony of the victims.

"He aggravated the trauma of the three children by dissembling," Hinrichs said.

Before sentence was pronounced, d'Ombrain addressed the court, fighting back tears. He said he now realized he was "sick, and even more so to have lied about it."

"I failed in the most despicable way a man can," he said, apologizing to his family and friends.

D'Ombrain said he needed to talk about the incidents but was unable to do so in jail or prison, where child molesters "fear for their lives."

Hinrichs ordered that he be given therapy in prison and serve his time in protective custody.

The remorse expressed by d'Ombrain Tuesday was "belated,' Hinrichs said.

"But I hope your remorse is genuine, because genuine remorse is needed if you are to cure yourself."

After the sentencing hearing, d'Ombrain's attorney, Richard



Rosen of Pacific Grove, filed a notice of appeal. D'Ombrain was also served with a copy of a lawsuit seeking civil damages on behalf of the victims.

D'Ombrain was a district executive for the Monterey Bay Area Council of the Boy Scouts of America. The molestations were unrelated to his scouting activities.

Area Thefts, Burglaries

Home Stripped of TVs, Stereo, Kites, Coins, VCR

A diamond and pearl ring, two televisions, stereo equipment and other household items were reported taken in the burglary of a Seaside home last week.

Bobbie Miley of the 500 block of Amador Street told police Monday that although the burglary took place between April 25 and May 2, she did not report the burglary until her insurance company suggested she do so.

Among the other items taken, she reported, were a video cassette recorder, a bicycle, kites, \$80 worth of

silver coins, and a camera. Total value of the missing items was reported to be \$5,207.

Also in Seaside, Carlos L. Jones, 22, told police that someone broke into his car and took a handgun while he was attending a basketball game at Seaside High School Mon-

Jones told police that the .22caliber semi-automatic pistol, valued at \$69, was taken after someone smashed the front passenger window, between 8:45 and 10:30 p.m.
